BEAR LAKE FALL RALLY UPDATE

Hello Fellow Airstreamers!

Your hosts, Joan/Steve Brinton and Linda/Ron Seitz wanted to give you a brief update. Planning is well underway and we are excited about this event for the club. The rally is scheduled for September 28-29 and October 1. The location is set for the Big Creek Campground where there are 46 lovely camp sites many with water front views/access and full hookups. There are convenient shower/restroom facilities. Two other campgrounds are adjacent to Big creek with approximately 97 campsites and additional facilities.

After September 17th Bear Lake State Park does not accept reservations and campsites are on a “walk in” basis only. Linda and I have been at this campground the last two years and there have been only 3 or 4 trailers in the entire park! Last year we were able to view 3 Bald Eagles fledge from their nest, Oh what a site to behold! This is part of the reason we wanted to host a rally at this location. This is a beautiful time of year and a perfect setting for the last rally of the year.

On arriving at the campground you will need either cash or a check to pay for your spot. We suggest entering the park and proceeding to the Big Creek Campground to pick out your site. You can return to the self-check-in gate and fill in the Park provided envelope. Listed below are a few of the important items to remember for the Rally:

CLUB TIDBITS

By popular demand, requested at the “Party on the Paunsaugunt” Spring Rally:

Julie’s Corn Dip

1 - 14.oz can white shoe peg corn, drained
1 cup shredded mexican blend cheese
3 or 4 green onions
3 tablespoons Mayo
Garlic salt to taste
Black pepper to taste
Cayenne pepper to taste
Mix all ingredients. Serve with Frito scoops.

A helpful camping tip from Cindy Smith:

I did want to alert you to a wonderful campground for a quick weekend. Check out Castle Rock Campground in Fremont Indian State Park. It’s just a couple of hours from Salt Lake. We camped there with our grandkids last weekend and it was lovely. I would try for a double-spot (we loved #22 and #23) since there is much more room, however, all spots are nicely

separated in the trees with picnic tables and water close by. Vault toilets. No hookups. Creek runs through the middle of the campground and there is a good “kids accessible” hike that leaves from the top of the campground and goes up the canyon to some old mines. Castle Rock itself is a great place to scramble around with some caves. Terrific bike trail along Sevier River that starts at the parking lot junction of Hwy 89 and I70. 5 -1/2 miles along the river to Big Rock Candy Mountain where there is ice cream! Or lunch.....but ice cream was nice. :-)

Fremont Indian State Park itself should not be missed. Excellent museum.

There are a few pull-thru sites at Castlerock CG that are at the entrance which are first come/ first serve. We are going to remember those as a quick night stop if we are on our way to Colorado or Moab on I70. We have stayed numerous times also in the KOA in Richfield as we travel. That’s a really nice full hook-up RV campground with laundry and swimming pool.

Hope your summer is going to be full of fun.
